The statue of the George Washington, the First President of the United States of America, is anchored outside at the front of Federal Hall. And this spot is likely the most photographed site for its national credential.

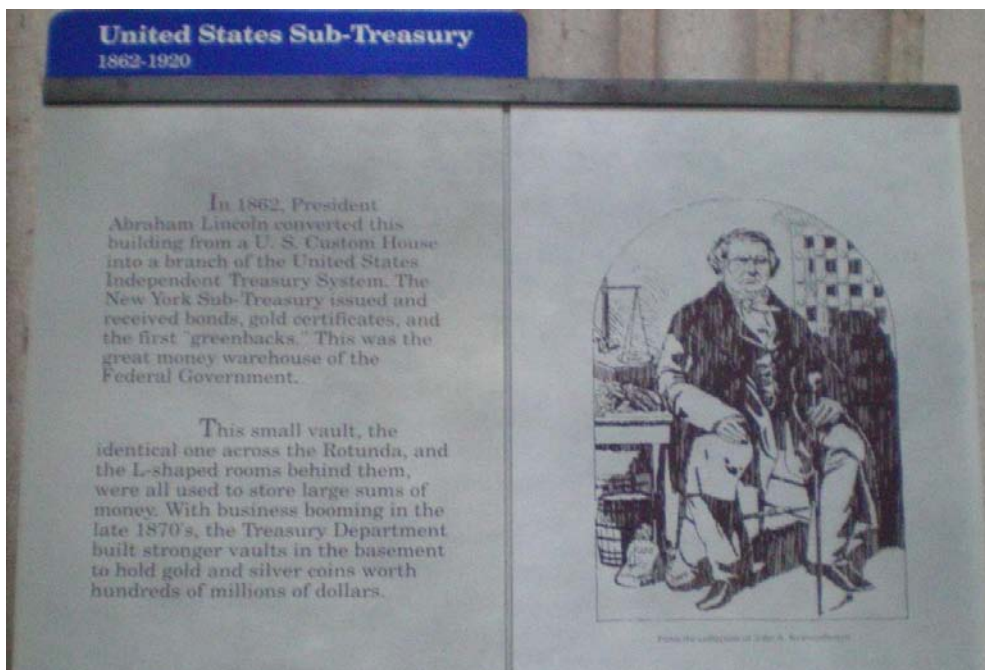


The front steps that lead to the historic buildings are highlighted with print of iconic words.

The architectural details of Greek Revival style are highlighted with elegant columns, bold structures of the balconies, and the surrounded vaults.



Above is the note, to state Federal Hall was converted into a branch of the United States Independent Treasury System. This was the great money warehouse of the Federal Government. And this is where small vaults were built to hold gold and silver coins worth of millions of dollars, thanks to the booming of the business in the late 1870's.
