Location - Armadale

Residential double storey townhouse

The brief: to create a sustainable tiny courtyard to reduce urban heat island, thus reduce heat to the surroundings of the building with succulents, fruit trees.

Result – green nook surprise with variety of spectacular color to all seasons on a tight budget with seasonal edible stone fruit and citrus – grey and rainwater are used in maintaining this green courtyard



Location - Narre Warren South

Residential double storey house

The brief: to create a sustainable landscape as a sanctuary to attract colorful birds, and reduce urban heat island, thus reduce heat to the surroundings of the building with hardy selected plants, fruit trees and cactus.

Result – a greenery sanctuary for entertainment and escape with a natural provision of cooling system to the building



Location - Caroline Springs

Residential single storey townhouse

The brief: to create a garden on a tight budget to soften the colonial detail of the building for a professional couple

Result - low maintenance garden beds with shots of blue and white agapanthus in summer months and green to all other remained seasons.



Location - Carrum Downs

Residential single storey townhouse

The brief: to create a modern landscape with hardy plants to reflect the sandy beach location

Result – modern application to the garden beds around the building, to compliment the architectural form of the building with hardy plants and aloe, with additional dried garden bed on either sides of front entrance with rock and succulents
