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**1rst FLOOR SITTING AREA - AFTER** 

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The window furnishings red brocade will remain as is, to be consistent with the living and dining area. An introduction of green foliage of succulent and bromeliad plants will bring nature into this lifeless space, to create a warm and fresh ambience. Plant is alive, and filters the air we breathe.

Recommended colour scheme and furniture style to transform this space. An old French console or a modern industrial metal storage will be a supportive element to the new focal point – the succulents, bromeliad and other complimented accent pieces Bare walls on either side of this space, to have lighting wall sconces regency style to add value and enhance the brocade of the curtains. Replace the pendant with a recessed light. Or a series of botanical prints,

to reflect the green succulent plants and bromeliad that are displayed there. Old look of wooden or ceramic plant pots will keep a consistency in style. A jute carpet will hold all styling and design elements together.

Propagate succulent cuttings Use ceramic with blue print or plain or earthy colour Use an efficient lighting source whenever is possible





## 1rst FLOOR SITTING AREA – BEFORE

The window furnishings are red brocade, with mixed design element that conflict to each other rather than complimentary and enhance the space. There are too many focal points, and forms. The gilded stool, the oriental design carpet, the vase, the plant pot and the stand are disconnected. It is an unwelcome space. The ceiling lighting fixture does not connect to the displayed items. This had shown a try-hard but unsuccessful....So how to transform this space for a look of a classic savoir-faire with a warming welcome to a sitting area?

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
